

Chiminea and Firepit Safety Guidelines

So that you can enjoy your chiminea/firepit in complete safety, here are a few guidelines which will help you to avoid any accidents.

- The chiminea/firepit should be sited on a flat surface that is none combustible. It should not be placed directly onto a wooden surface.
- The surface the chiminea/firepit is to be placed on should be flat and level. The chiminea/firepit should not wobble at all.
- Do not leave the chiminea/firepit unattended. It gets very hot and could pose a hazard to both children and pets.
- Make sure that the chiminea/firepit is placed away from other materials that could burn or catch fire, both overhead and to the side, such as tree branches, sheds, fences and plants. Keep in mind that smoke will rise through the chimney or center of the firepit, so consider anything above it like trees or overhangs.
- Never use your chiminea/firepit indoors. Despite their appearance and effectiveness at venting smoke, chiminea/firepit are only designed for outdoor use.
- It is advisable to keep a fire extinguisher handy, just in case.
- The only approved firepit is one which has a grill grate to cover the open flame.
